## Honors Program Outcomes

- s Develop and explore in greater depth and/or breadth the subject matter of the course/discipline.
- s Gain knowledge about accessing and using resources outside of the classroom to enhance
- s Understand, initiate, create, and/or build a project of original work that adds to the body of knowledge in the field of study or discipline and/or to the community

## Faculty Responsibilities

In order to successfully complete an Honors Contract Proposal, the faculty member will:

- s Co-create with the student the Honors Contract Proposal, which focuses on at least one Honors Program Outcome
- s Co-create with the student the Proposals goals, objectives, meeting times, and method of evaluation

- s Meet with the student regularly throughout the semester, engaging and mentoring the student, to share in the discovery of new ideas, information, data, and/or methodologies in the field of study.
- s Guide the student through the completion of the project, including research, campus or community service, presentations, publication, or product.
- s Evaluate the process and completion of the project, and share how the evaluation is determined.
- s Submit the completed Contract Proposal to the Honors Committee by the due date.
- s Earn 3 hours of Flex credit for every contract supervised, with up to 5 contracts or 15 Flex hours accrued.

## Student Responsibilities


In order to successfully complete an Honors Proposal Contract, the student will:

- s Receive an A or a B as their overall grade for the course
- s Co-create with the faculty member the Honors Contract Proposal, which focuses on at least one Honors Program Outcome
